### Worship with Us This Sunday, August 21

The sermon is titled "No king but Caesar" and the Scripture reading is John 19:1-16. Pastor Tim Schrag asks, "This statement was true in one sense, not true in another. And this tension continues into today."

Our Scripture Focus this week and throughout the summer will come from the Bible Memory Passages which our children are studying.

The Ministry Moment this Sunday (postponed from July 31) will feature Mennonite Disaster Service and one of the project in Detroit. Lois Hochstetler, who is serving there, writes: *Disasters come, disasters go, and we have a way of paying attention to the most recent one. In Detroit, it has been almost two years since the “invisible flood” that quickly disappeared from city streets, and ran into the basements of houses through storm sewers, leaving sewer, muck and mold in its wake. You have probably heard of Detroit’s remarkable recovery in the past two years, but what is not being said is that the recovery has not reached the low income communities of the city. Mennonite Disaster Service is working to address that issue. Grateful homeowners, many of whom live with disabilities, little income and a household of three generations are welcoming us into their homes to haul ruined treasures, ruined furniture and moldy materials out to the curb, to pull out water soaked walls, and treat for mold, slime, and bacteria. In cases where there is still water, our workers are working in hazmat suits and gas masks. Little by little, people are getting their living spaces back.*

They are given primarily to refugee and displaced children, helping students and teachers add some normalcy to disrupted lives. 25,513 were shipped last year to Jordan, Iraq, Syria, Ethiopia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Lebanon, Burundi, Ukraine, Haiti, Russia, Democratic People's Republic of Korea (North Korea), U.S., Serbia and El Salvador.

## Concert by Glenn Wilson

Glenn Wilson, with his group TromBari, will be featured in a FREE concert followed by the Midwest premier of Night Bird Song - The Thomas Chapin Story at the Normal Theatre on Saturday August 27th. The concert will be at 6:00, the film will be at 7:00 and will be followed by a talkback with Glenn, noted jazz critic Howard Mandel and, via Skype, the Emmy award winning filmmaker, Stephanie Castillo. Thomas Chapin was a friend of Glenn's and bandmate in the Lionel Hampton Orchestra for two years. Thomas was cut down at the peak of his career by leukemia in 1998 and the film is a moving tribute. This is a production of Glenn's 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation Further Jazz Inc. and is supported by a Town of Normal Harmon Arts Grant.
