## Stories about Peace-making in Columbia Sunday, April 23, at 6:00 p.m. Metamora Mennonite Church

Invitation to hear from MCC Colombian partner on April 23. Juana Alicia Ruiz is an Afro-Colombian community leader of Mampuján, a rural community on the Caribbean Coast of Colombia. Mampuján was forcefully displaced by paramilitary armed forces in 2000 and has since been working to rebuild their community. MCC, working in the region through an Anabaptist organization, Sembrandopaz, began the work of trauma healing with the evangelical church of Mampuján by teaching traditional quilting techniques and opening safe spaces for storytelling. This work evolved into the creation of large, community-made tapestries that tell the stories of violence and displacement, as well as the resilience and hope of Mampuján. This community process has grown in the past decade to now function as an organization called Women Weaving Dreams and Flavors of Peace, of which Juana is the leader. On Sunday, April 23, at 6:00 p.m., area churches and community members are invited to Metamora Mennonite Church (1393 Mennonite Road in Metamora) to hear Juana speak. She will share some of the group's handiwork as well as the stories of the healing and peace that they are working to bring to Colombia's violent history.
