Lenten Focus: This year's visual focus is "The Curtain of Lent" The fabric draped over the cross reminds us of a curtain that is hung at a window, and the knots in the fabric symbolize how God's promises connect--or "knot" us--to God. In preparing for his ministry and the fulfillment of God's plan, Jesus "pulled a curtain" over his everyday life--his routine, his family, and his disciples--to spend 40 days alone in the wilderness, fasting and praying. During Lent, we also can choose to "pull a curtain" over things in our lives--distractions, unhealthy habits, or areas of imbalance--in order to focus more on God's work in our lives and reflect on the promises we find in Jesus' life, death, and resurrection.

Beginning this Sunday, during the CE hour, a six week Lenten study using the book "Embracing the Uncertain: A Lenten Study for Unsteady Times" by Magrey R. deVegas will be offered. This study will use characters from scripture to focus on the uncertainties of life such as worry, mortality, forgiveness, faith, etc. If you are not currently attending a class, you are welcome to participate in this study. Although the book is not required, it is an excellent read. The class will be taught by Lynette Miller and will be held in Pastor Tim's office.
