New Adult Sunday School classes will begin. There are three options available:

Trauma and Healing In this class the following aspects of trauma will be addressed: definitions, common responses, effects of unhealed trauma, ways to break the cycle of trauma, and the church's response to trauma. Some members of the congregation who have experienced trauma will tell their stories. Local agencies who work with trauma survivors will address the class. The class can be meaningful to anyone because trauma has touched many lives.

Making Sense of God is a discussion class led by Cory Culbertson and based on the book of the same name by Timothy Keller. The class will look at some of the pressing questions of Christian faith in an secular world, like:

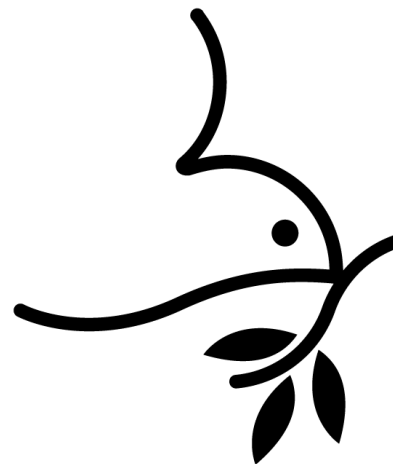
- Is faith in God intellectually defensible?
